Conditions that affect a person's thinking, feeling, mood, and ability to relate to others.


Conditions that affect a person's concept formation, oral or written comprehension, listening ability, memory, and recall.








ILLITERACY DEFINED

INTERVENTION


Accommodations a school makes including remedial classes, tutoring, reading tests aloud to students, extended deadlines, and make-up work.







EMOTIONAL FACTORS


The ability to identify and manage one's own emotions and the emotions of others.




INFLUENCE OF PHYSICAL DISABILITIES
